

### UROLOGICAL PATHOLOGY CONSULTATION SERVICE

Thank you for choosing me as a consultant in uropathology over the years. This has enabled me to offer a consultation service that is available to pathology colleagues, urologists and patients from around the world for over 2 decades. The case material has served as an invaluable educational resource for over 20 fellows in urologic pathology and several visiting physicians worldwide. It has also stimulated numerous research projects, which have helped produce ideas used in my 300+ papers published in the literature, and in the numerous books I have authored/edited. The questions posed in consultation letters have helped me understand common diagnostic dilemmas in clinical practice and enhanced my educational seminars and conference presentations making them more practical for the practicing pathologist.

Some of my most notable contributions to the field include:

- Editor-in-Chief of the eighth edition of the TNM AJCC Cancer Staging manual (2016)
- Co-authored the lead 2016 WHO classification system chapters for tumors of the prostate, bladder, kidney, penis and testis [authored 21 chapters (2016); 7 chapters (2002) in blue books]
- First major descriptions of entities in genitourinary pathology including lymphoepithelioma-like carcinoma of the bladder, micropapillary carcinoma of the bladder, acquired cystic disease associated renal cell carcinoma, clear cell-papillary renal cell carcinoma, thyroid-like carcinoma of the kidney, tubulocystic carcinoma of the kidney, intratubular large cell hyalinizing sertoli cell neoplasia of the testis (a distinctive condition of the Peutz-Jeghers syndrome) and low-grade glandular tumors of the urachus
- Co-authored WHO/ISUP Classification of Urothelial tumors and ISUP recommendations on Gleason grading (2004 and 2016)
